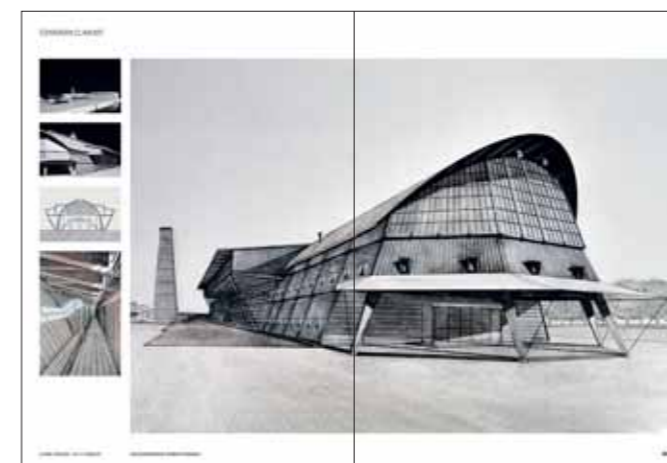
Analogous Old-New Architecture

Analogous architecture and old-new architecture are key aspects of the teaching of Miroslav Šik at the ETH Zurich. During his first, analogous period there between 1983 and 1991, Šik was Assistant at the Chair of Fabio Reinhart and in effect the spokesman of an architectural movement that became renowned far beyond the borders of Switzerland and is still influential today. It presented itself to the public with a touring exhibition, a large-scale "Black Box" and perspective drawings of its projects. In his second, old-new period between 1999 and 2018, Miroslav Šik has been Professor of Design at the ETH Zurich, producing reform architecture with ensembles, milieu atmospheres and midcomfort properties. His architecture, theory and teaching represent a specific, relevant pillar of Swiss and European architecture.

This extensive volume contains 135 selected student works from both periods. Many of their authors are renowned Swiss architects today. Large-scale perspective drawings, collages, detailed plans and concisely formulated project descriptions clearly illustrate the methods and their results. The volume also contains a Foreword by Miroslav Šik, an extensive text by Lukas Imhof on conception and design methods, as well as enlightening essays and interview quotes from former students on analogous and old-new architecture. A collection of the design programmes, described in a characteristically trenchant manner, and an illustrated description of the famous Jaxon drawing technique, with its many anecdotes, round off the extensive presentation of projects.

Philippe Meyer

Transparency and solid construction complement and depend on each other in the projects by Philippe Meyer. The volume presents a cross-section of the precisely defined projects that have been executed since 2003. They include expansive villas in the regional round Geneva, the new Physics Building of the University of Geneva or a residential building for students in Montreux.

Kast Kaeppli

The two Bern-based architects Adrian Kast and Thomas Kaeppli founded offices in 2008, including a branch in Basel. In terms of their floor plan, section and construction, their buildings are well-considered, precise structures that have been developed in a sophisticated way: for instance various residential buildings, three kindergartens and several school buildings.

Graeme Mann & Patricia Capua Mann

The architectural couple with contrasting roots, Graeme Mann from Scotland, and Patricia Capua Mann from Italy, founded their office in Lausanne in 1990. Since then they have produced a remarkable oeuvre. All buildings are developed with consideration and care: for instance the large multipurpose and sports hall in Villaz-St-Pierre, which is anchored into the topography, or the powerful volume for a secondary school in Gland.

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Butikofer de Oliveira Vernay

Olivia de Oliveira from São Paulo, Brazil and the two western Swiss architects Serge Butikofer and Olivier Vernay founded their office in 2005. Their important, substantial projects include two carefully developed school facilities, impressive residential buildings in the Eco-Quarter in Lausanne and the planned major urban facility for the Cantonal Library in Fribourg.

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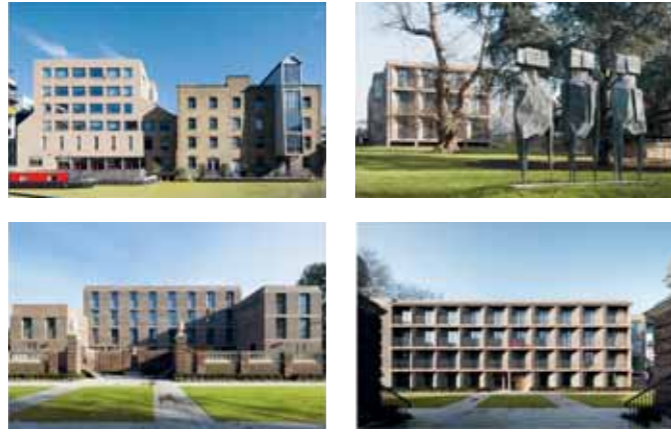

Henley Halebrown – London

Simon Henley and Gavin Halebrown are the protagonists of the London office that was officially known as Buschow Henley from 1995 onwards, before changing its name to Henley Halebrown Rorisson between 2010 and 2016. This volume presents a number of buildings that are often integrated into London's dense urban texture and radiate a highly self-assertive and poetic expression.
